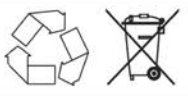

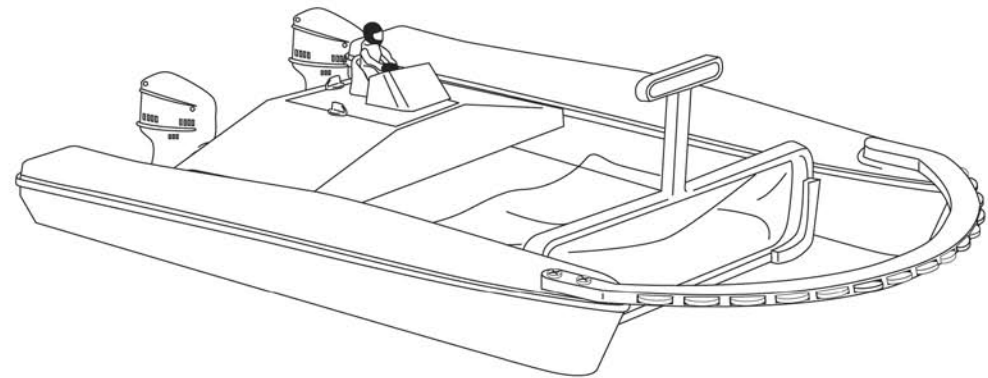

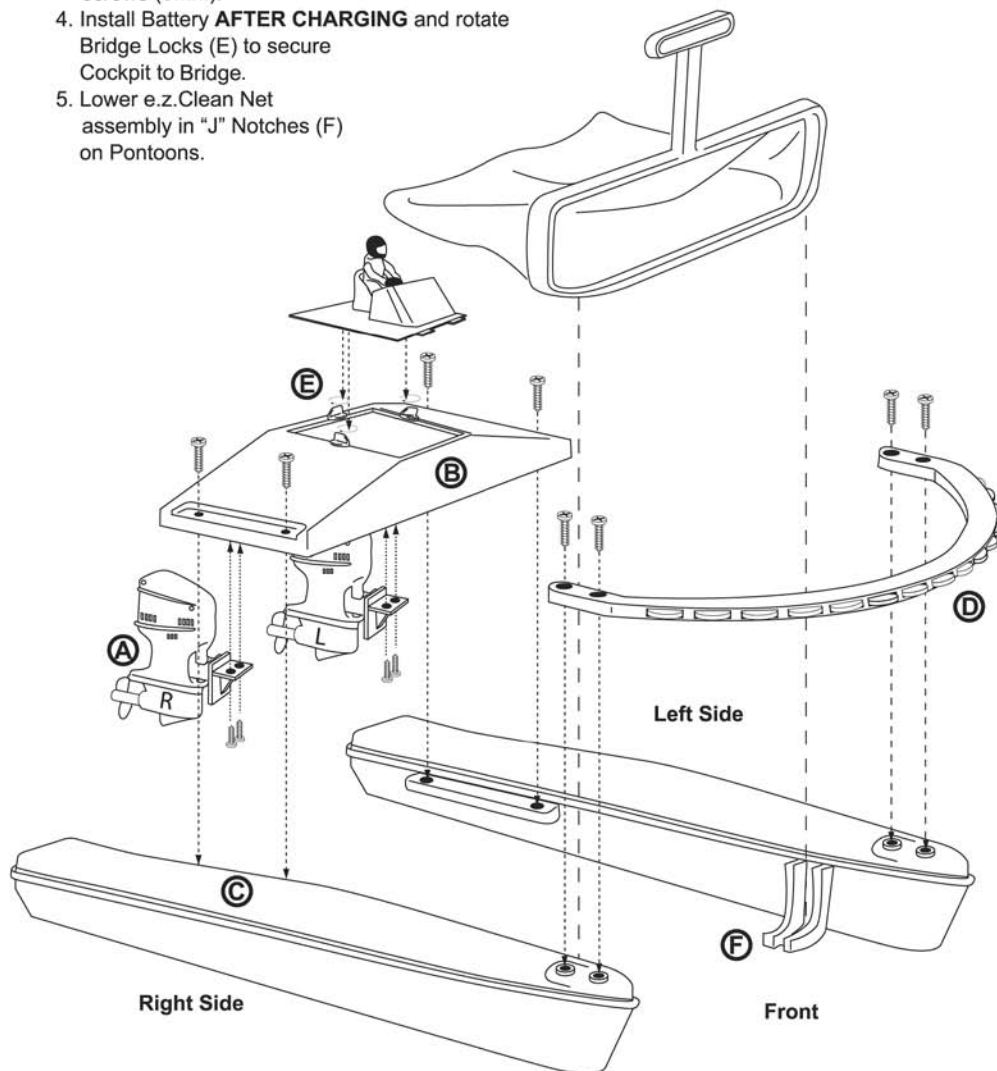
BOAT ASSEMBLY

1. Identify Left and Right Motor by markings on propellers (A). Plug in motor marked L to left side of Bridge (B) and secure using two supplied screws (3.5mm). Plug in motor marked R to right side of bridge (B) and secure using two supplied screws (3.5mm).

Note: if you are having trouble plugging in make sure you have the correct Motor on the correct side. Motor Plugs are NOT interchangeable.

2. Using 4 supplied screws (6mm), attach Pontoon (C) to Bridge keeping Nose of Pontoon towards front.
3. Align Bumper (D) with screw holes on Nose of Pontoon and secure with 4 supplied screws (6mm).
4. Install Battery **AFTER CHARGING** and rotate Bridge Locks (E) to secure Cockpit to Bridge.
5. Lower e.z.Clean Net assembly in "J" Notches (F) on Pontoon.

CHARGING THE RECHARGEABLE BATTERY PACK

1. Connect the battery plug to the power adapter's plug.
2. Insert the power adapter into a wall outlet to start charging.
3. Unplug the power adapter from the wall outlet when charging is done, disconnect the battery pack from the power adapter.

NOTE: Charge the battery pack for 4 to 5 hours for optimum full performance on the initial charge and about 4 hours for other charges.

CAUTIONS: As with all electric products, precautions should be observed during handling and use to prevent electric shock. The power adapter should be periodically examined for leaks, loose wiring and other conditions that may result in the risk of fire, electric shock or other personal injury. If you suspect a problem, do not use the adapter until it is properly repaired. Do not charge the battery pack for over 10 hours, as this will result in damage to the batteries.

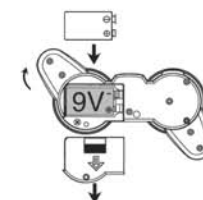
BATTERY INSTALLATION - SKIMMER

1. Open the 3 locks of the battery compartment cover of the skimmer as shown and remove cockpit.
2. Connect the battery pack's plug to the plug in the battery compartment. Make sure the battery pack is well mounted in the battery compartment.
3. Replace the battery compartment cover and lock it.



BATTERY INSTALLATION - REMOTE CONTROLLER

1. Slide the battery door out of the controller as shown.
2. Install a 9V battery (included) in the battery compartment as shown. Make sure to follow the correct positive (+) and negative (-) polarities with the corresponding markings inside the battery compartment.
3. Slide the battery door back into place.



PREPARATION

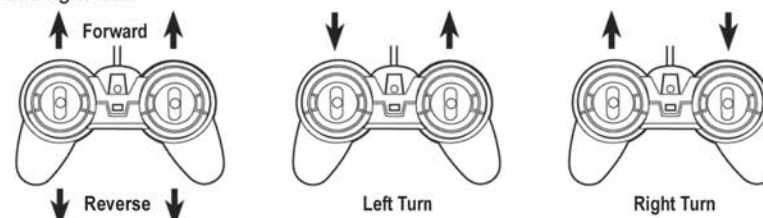
1. Install the antenna into the antenna hole on the remote controller as shown, pull tip of the antenna to extend.
2. Move the power switches on the remote controller and the skimmer to ON.
3. Place the skimmer gently into the pool, letting it float on water.

NOTE: Do not leave controller on the ground with joysticks facing down. This can cause false starts.



OPERATION

The left and right joysticks on the controller are used to control the left and right motors on the RC skimmer. When the left joystick is pushed forward or back the left motor will run. When the right joystick is pushed forward or back the right motor will run. By combination of pushing forward the left and/or right joysticks as shown, the RC skimmer can be controlled to go forward, reverse, left turn and right turn.



After use, take the skimmer out of water, move the power switches on the remote controller and skimmer to OFF.

NOTE: Do not operate the skimmer while it is out of water. Never touch the propellers on the skimmer to avoid possible injury.
